London, Dec. 13.—(AP)—The foreign ministers' session scheduled for today was postponed until Monday on British initiative, in order to cool tempers to cool after last night's violent argument. The postponement was announced by the conference secretariat. A member of the U. S. delegation said it was agreed that another session today would only result in quick tempers and confusion. The two day recess will give the ministers time to plan a course of action.
