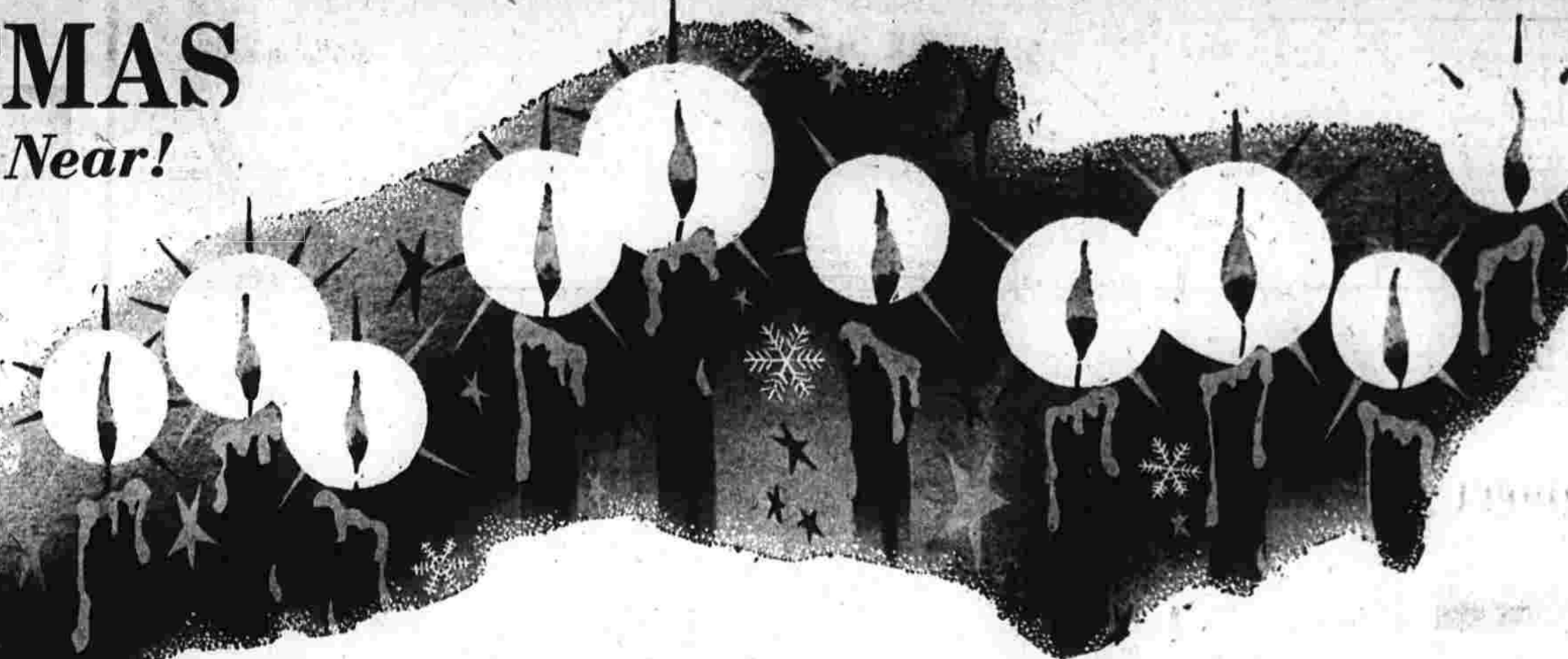

Washington, Dec. 22.—(AP)—American aid to Europe may exceed \$3,000,000,000 in one year if President Truman's long-range recovery proposal is not trimmed by Congress, Senator Taft (R., Ohio), suggested today. Taft told reporters that if the President's request for \$2,000,000,000 for the first 15 months of the Marshall plan is granted, additional outlays of American money in Europe may total \$1,200,000,000 in the year beginning July 1.
