Vets' Hospital Denies Laxity

Charges by Shelton Resident Disputed by Patients and Officials

Hartford, Jan. 24.—(AP)—Charges by a Shelton man that conditions at the State Veterans home at Rocky Hill "rank to high heaven" have been disputed by patients and officials of the institution.

The charges were made yesterday by Harold W. Zetterstrom of Shelton, whose Navy veteran son, Harold G., 24, died at the hospital Jan. 10. The father complained of conditions at the hospital in a letter to Gov. James M. McLaughlin and the governor asked for a full report on the case of Col. Raymond F. Gates, commandant of the home.

Let inspect Hospital Gates said last night that he had written a letter to the governor, describing the conditions at the home, and asking that the letter be referred to a committee to be named, however, were given permission by Governor McLaughlin to inspect the hospital and interview patients.

Most of the patients expressed themselves as satisfied with overall conditions, their treatment and the food at the institution.

Zetterstrom asserted in his letter to the governor that "my son was put in a room so cold he had to sleep in his robe; the smell of the hospital was so bad that it was almost unbearable; the food was so poor that it was almost inedible; the nurses were so inefficient that they were almost useless; the doctors were so incompetent that they were almost a waste of money; the patients were so miserable that they were almost dead."

Dr. Sweet said most of the patients at the hospital complained too much heat, adding that the father's charges probably were made under "emotional stress."

Daughter Roped and Chained for 10 Years in Room at Home
