Local Residents Who Are Paying Taxes on \$10,000 and Over

745 Persons, Firms Included on the Roll; Cheney Brothers Lead

Silk Firm is Assessed For \$7,700,645; Alexander Jarvis Heads the Individuals With \$258,531 Followed by Orford Soap Company

Cheney Brothers remains the town's largest taxpayer according to an assessment of \$10,000 or over. The local firm is in the list for \$7,700,645 as compared with \$5,352,202 for 1947—an increase of over \$2,300,000.

There were 745 persons listed as paying taxes on amounts in excess of \$10,000 which is about 100 more than in this same category last year.

Jarvis Leads
The largest individual taxpayer this year as last, is Alexander Jarvis who is listed on \$258,531 personally, and the Alexander Jarvis company is listed at \$154,192.

The Orford Soap company is the second largest taxpayer at \$112,423. This is up from \$87,753 last year. The John Hackett estate shows a large increase from \$84,448 last year to \$134,033.

The Hartman Tobacco company, the third largest taxpayer, also shows a large increase from \$137,156 to \$340,317. Mayor and Mendelsohn are in the list for \$94,029, an increase of \$700,000 over 1946 assessment.
