Transport Turns Back After Riot

Bremenham, Germany, April 2.—A riot was held by 40 soldiers being returned to the United States as mental patients forced an Army transport to turn back to this port. Army authorities disclosed today.

The group, which was being returned under guard, became violently unruly. The Army reported considerable damage was inflicted to furniture in the transport as they attempted to beat their way out. It added.

The Army said nobody was hurt. Troops being deployed to the U. S. helped guard quell the rioting. Six of the most violent patients were sent to a mental hospital at Wiesbaden. Other rioters remained aboard under heavy guard.

An earlier Army announcement said the ship, the Zeppelin E. Vance, had turned back because of action taken aboard.

The transport departed again today, under increased guard.

Hartford, April 2.—(AP)—The State Development Commission has protested against a proposed \$4,000,000 appropriation to the Tennessee Valley authority for a steam power plant at New Johnsonville, Tenn.

In a telegram to the House Appropriations committee, the commission asserted yesterday: "If it now becomes the Federal policy to subsidize steam power plants in direct competition with privately owned utilities, and if the resultant lower rates are to be used as an incentive to attract industries away from present industrial regions, such as Connecticut, we feel that it is not only unfair competition to the industries now providing the bulk of the taxes which make Federal subsidies possible, but is particularly unfair to their employees whose continued employment and wages depend upon their profitable operation."

Bowles Gains Local Second

Stand on Truman, Liberalism Lauded; Talks Here Tuesday Night

Manchester Democrats today passed a hearty second to the proposal advanced last night by Chester Bowles that President Truman should withdraw from the coming presidential contest at Bowles, a leading contender for the Connecticut gubernatorial nomination, apparently gained a large amount of local ground by his speech last night, delivered in the hall of the Manchester branch of a Rooseveltian liberal. He will speak here next Thursday night under the auspices of the Democratic Town Committee, and local party leaders expect that he will strike out vigorously for the furtherance of his ideas.

Stated Feeling Chairman William V. Dehan of the Democratic Town Committee this morning said that Bowles has "rattled the majority feeling" in Manchester town committee" in urging Truman's retirement from politics.

Dehan said that a meeting of the Town Committee will be called for tonight at which time the local group will take a definite stand on the Bowles proposal.

All that will be required in addition to this will be the names of the other persons in the family of all ages, and the church of which they are members in the community, or their religious preference in case they are not now associated with any Manchester church.

Attorney Gryk said that he is sure that Bowles has captured the first place in the "candidate running" in Manchester. He thinks that Attorney Thomas Dodd still has the edge here, but he added that "there are a lot of people on the fence right now."

Chairman Dehan gave Bowles at least an even chance, and remarked that up to two or three weeks ago Dodd had the edge but that Bowles has "come up tremendously" since then.

Popular Reaction There is a general feeling that by what Attorney Rouse called "his bold action" Bowles has captured Democratic Party political initiative in the town and evoked a popular reaction to national elections.

It was learned today that at a meeting of the Democratic State Central Committee dated for next Tuesday, the Bowles position will be one of the "unofficial" subjects for discussion.

Attempts to secure comment from Thomas Z. Danaher, Attorney John D. LaBelle, William P. Quish and N. Charles Boggs, as well as other leading Democrats were not successful today due to the absence of these men from town. It is expected that they will comment on the situation at the local meeting of the Town committee tonight.

There had been some reports that if Bowles broke with the President, he might not speak here next Tuesday, but today Chairman Dehan said that the arrangements are complete for that occasion.

The film was based on a play of the same name by Konstantin M. Simonov, following his trip to America in 1946. The award amounted to 100,000 rubles (\$18,000).

A similar award was given Eys Erenburg, Soviet commentator, for his novel "Storm." The novel contained many passages critical of the U. S. and British governments and their policies during the war. He also visited America two years ago.

Pravda editorial acclaimed the two awards as emphasizing the importance of the battle in Soviet art "against apocryphism before things foreign."

Small Children Go to Classes

Two-Thirds of Kindergarten Age Enrolled in Public Schools

Hartford, April 2.—Two-thirds of the Connecticut children of kindergarten age are enrolled in public school classes, a completion by the State Department of Education shows 24,325 in kindergarten.

Of the 189 towns in Connecticut, 81 have kindergartens. In these 81 towns there are 21,840 children of kindergarten age—four or five years old. Kindergarten attendance is not mandatory and parents have elected to send 7,515 young children to kindergartens available to them.

36,311 in Group The recent state enumeration showed 36,311 children in the four to five year old group whom the kindergartens are intended to serve. Thus there are 4,501 children in the 88 towns which do not have kindergartens.

Hartford reported 2,847 in kindergartens. New Haven 2,599, Bridgeport 2,217, Waterbury 1,246, New Britain, 1,152, Stamford 992. Of the 24,325 attending kindergartens, 2,298 are transported to and from school at town expense and 1,819 are transported by parents with no charge to their towns.
