London, April 6-(P)-A definite anti-Labor trend was proclaimed by Conservatives today in Britain's "little election" of district council-men in England and Wales. Voting to fill 3,062 seats in more than 500 districts began Saturday and is expected to end today. Unofficial results thus far show the Conservatives have woo 255 atives have won 288 seats against a loss of 23. lost 236, the unofficial tailies show, Independents, running with Con-servative support, gained 71 and lost 34, while those without Conservative backing gained i lost 154.
