Basic Conflict Seen Religious

Mrs. Luce Declares Only Christianity Defense

Hartford, April 8—(F) — Using Christianity and Calholicism synonymously, Clare Boothe Luce,

Christianity and Catholicism synonymously, Clare Booths Lace, former congressionman and writer, in a lecture Tuesday night at Bushnell auditorium declared that only Christianity defends this country against Communism.

"The question is, particularly in piaces like Italy, is: Will the Catholics stand ?", she said.

"The time has gone when we must prove the existence of God to those who doubt," she asserted. "It is time for us to stand up and perhaps to die for Christ. The Church has stood by us. Now, in the moment of crisis, we must stand by the Church."

It was Mrs. Luce's sixth appearance in Hartford, but her first since she was converted to Catholicism more than two years ago. She spoke under the auspices of St. Joseph College alumnae and on the subject, "The American Way and Christianity."

Her purpose in speaking, she explained, was to define the "real and basic conflict between the American way and the Soviet way of life" which she maintained was to be found on the level of religion.

The American way she identified

The American way she identifie with the popular conception of freedom, the freedom for and of the will, the freedom to choose between good and svil, a freedom not granted by governments but by The Maker alone.

"The Russians believe," she said,

"that man by nature is not free and can never be. They believe reality is matter. They believe man is been to live and die like a Death is a brutal swindle of il his hopes."
"A Grand hotel of existen equipped with atomic conven-iences," was this famous coiner of phrases' manner of describing the

"Our freedom," she asserted, undoubtedly being threatened in home and abroad. At the momen as things stand now, it is a ques-tion of time before we are in World war III."
She admitted that the situation could change, but that our freedom of thoice "is slowly being curtailed as alien concepts of government enter our own, or as we begin to steel ourselves for an-other war."

At one point in her lecture Mrs.
Lucs declared that American
people are freer to choose from
more material and spiritual concepts than any other group in the world.
"Nothing," she insisted, "but freedom of choics could possibly explain the new look!"






