Colombia Breaks Ties With Russia After Two Arrests

Russian Agents Held Italian Strike In Connection With Revolution Which Devastated Bogota And Killed More Than 300 Citizens of Nation

By The Associated Press Colombia has broken diplomatic relations with Soviet Russia, the government radio said today, following the arrest of two Russian agents in connection with the revolu-tion which devastated down-

In calling home their diplomatic representatives to Russia, the Co-iombians took the same action that had been ordered last October by Brazil and Chile. The official Bogota radio said 15 foreign agents in all had found, some of them alive.

Conference to Resum The proadcast announced that Inter-American conference resume in Bogota "so that munism could not triumph over Colombia and the rest of the ns of the hemisphere." Posable joint action against Com-

munium by the American nations is one of the problems slated for discussion in the sessions.

Russians Build

Mostly Secret Police Units Being Sent in To Eastern Germany

Berlin, April 12—(P)—Allied in-telligence reports said today the Russians have been increasing their strength in Germany, mostly with secret police units.

An informed United States source said these increases had

been "by no means en masse but they have been noticeable." It was believed the police (MVD)

The control measures also have been linked with the new travel and freight restrictions imposed by the Russians on the western Allies

in Berlin. American sources would venture no estimate of Soviet strength in Germany. They said, however, there had been increases recently German reports have claimed that some new troop units have appeared in the Soviet zone. The Socialist press said considerable numbers of Mongolian troops had been brought into Leipzig.

Forrestal Says Soviets Know How to Make News Tidbits Missile; Questioned by House Committee

Washington, April 12.—(P) -Defense Secretary Forrestal told Congress today that Russia knows how to make the atomic bomb but is not yet able to do so. Forrestal's admission came up in quesbefore the House Armed Services committee which is considering a bill to draft men 19 through 25 years of age.

After his testimony, Forrestal was asked by reporters whether he is certain that Russis does not have an atomic bomb.

"I would not care to amplify that," he said. "I will have to let that stand."
