The war-born farm land boom has reached the dizzy heights at which the last one exploded to bring tragedy to thousands of farmers.

The Agriculture department reported today that farm hand values on March 1 had climited to the record of March, 1920—a level that collapsed shortly thereafter.

Sparking the current boom, the department said, is the continued department said, is the continued high farm product prices and record farm income.

Whether the present boom might collapse like the earlier one, the department did not try to forecast. The sharp break in land prices in 1920 followed a steep decline in foreign buying of American food.

Officials said there are no signs now of any big drop in foreign demand. In fact, the multi-billion-dollar European recovery program is expected to maintain a good foreign farm product market for another year or more.









