Hartford, April 23—(P)—The Connecticut Association on Public School Superintendents has joined other educational groups in a drive for pay hikes for instructors at the University of Connecticut and the four state Teachers' colleges.

Supt. of Schools Fred D. Wish, Ir., in commenting on a report Wednesday by the State Department of Education which outlined the need for expansion of teacher colleges to meet the demand for

teacher-training institutions elsewhere than it has in Connecticut teacher-training institutions. As a result, our Teachers' colleges and the University of Connecticut are finding it difficult to attract and retain the desirable type of teachers of teachers. After all," he said. "the caliber of these teachers' teachers is a most important factor in the quality of teachers who go into local school systems."

The association, he disclosed, has unanimously passed a resolution to support the State Board of Education, the commissioner of education and the officers of the University of Connecticut "to secure adequate professional compensation" for teachers at the institutions. They did not share in the pay benefits which the \$20,500,000 state aid for education grant passed in 1947 gave the public school teachers.

Further backing for teachers' teachers is expected to come from the Connecticut Education association at its representative assembly to be held in Hartford May 15.
