Ten Persons Die in Blast

Shattering Tank Explosion and Fire Occur at Koppers Plant

Kearny, N. J., May 18.—A shattering tank explosion and fire shortly after midnight last night killed at least 10 persons at the sprawling Koppers company tank and chemical division plant.

Nine bodies were taken from the ruins of the building along Hackensack river and a tenth victim died in a hospital. Firemen searched the wreckage for additional victims of the blast that set off a fire in an adjoining building of the plant.

The company's office in Pittsburgh said the explosion occurred when a strong wind blew part of the contents of a 50,000-gallon tank of distillate against a hot pipe. The distillate, used in making other chemicals, "flashed," and then set off the tank explosion. A service building, laboratory and machine shop were burned.

First reports said the blast was caused by blazing naphthalene. Detective Sgt. Charles Schillon had estimated from eyewitness reports that 11 workers were trapped in the building when the explosion occurred.

Reflection seen in miles away. The blast, heard over a 15-mile area, sent a sheet of flame into the air over the plant's tank and chemical division. The reflection against low-hanging clouds was reported as seen 16 miles away. A series of minor explosions followed the first blast.

Hudson County Police Lt. George Kelly, in headquarters a half-mile away, said the blast "seemed to envelop the whole building. It was the closest thing I've ever seen to an atomic explosion."

Two men who had just left the building said they saw a large ball of fire and a cloud of black smoke rising from the nearby Hackensack river.

Union Ervoys Give Reports

Local TWUA Delegates Attended National Parley at Atlantic City

Managers of the TWUA at the 17th National Convention of the Textile Workers Union of America held recently in Atlantic City, are now reporting to members of Local 83 TWUA, in Manchester, the results of their trip.

Attending for the Manchester Local were Frank Kelly, Matthew Faton and Joseph Kulas.

In a series of reports on the activities of the convention, Manchester Union members will be given a summary of action taken.

One of the important resolutions passed by the convention, Mr. Kelly stated, was Resolution No. 15 concerning the World Federation of Trade Unions.

This motion condemns the present use of the World Federation for anti-unionistic political purposes, and urges that the CIO withdraw wholly from the organization as it now stands organized.

Next of resolutions.

The Resolution, as adopted, follows:

The TWUA was created by the trade unions of the world as a means of labor participation in the post-war world. TWUA was conceived as an organization through which the common aspirations and hopes of the working people of the world could be united into policy and action directed toward post-war reconstruction and labor participation in the writing of the peace.

TWUA wholeheartedly supported the anti-Communist movement and joined in cooperative efforts for relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction of war-devastated countries. Ever conscious of the dangers to freedom, we urged that food and aid be extended to needy people of the various countries but that no circumstances used as a means to coerce or influence them in their rights of self-government.

At the London conference of February, 1945, TWUA welcomed the declared purpose of the Allied governments to give effect to the principles of the Atlantic Charter and jointly to assist the people in every liberated country in creating the conditions in which a stable and representative government, resting upon the free consent of the people, can come into existence. TWUA spoke of a world peace insured by industrial development of the undeveloped countries; full use of material resources and an economic organization in which production, full employment and a rising standard of living would be possible in all lands. These inspirational ideals were reaffirmed at the Atlantic conference and forward-looking programs and social reforms were formulated.

But in the years following the war it has become painfully clear that the representatives of the Russian labor unions look upon these objectives as mere slogans to furnish them a world forum to further the expansionist drives of the Russian government. Thus they have prevented meetings of TWUA to block discussion and the formulation of labor's attitude toward the Marshall plan. They and their adherents have organized in constant efforts to remove from official positions the representatives of world trade union leaders who would follow the line of the Cominform. Because CIO has endorsed the Marshall plan, it has been attacked, the official organ of the WFTU, in its efforts to bring about a world peace.

Diseases Led By Chickenpox

Top List for 30th Consecutive Week in State Health Report

Hartford, May 18.—New cases of chickenpox reported in Connecticut last week numbered 278, the State Health department said today, compared with 279 the week before.

It was the 30th consecutive week that chickenpox topped the list on the health department's weekly report.

Measles, mumps, whooping cough, German measles, diphtheria and meningococcal meningitis were also on the increase during the past seven days. Mumps increased from 117 to 201 cases, measles from 126 to 154 cases, whooping cough cases from 19 to 22, and cases of German measles rose from 15 to 15. Although there had been no cases of either diphtheria or meningococcal meningitis a week previous, there was one case each reported of both diseases during the week just ended.

Scarlet fever cases remained unchanged with 20 cases reported.

Union Ervoys Give Reports

Local TWUA Delegates Attended National Parley at Atlantic City

Managers of the TWUA at the 17th National Convention of the Textile Workers Union of America held recently in Atlantic City, are now reporting to members of Local 83 TWUA, in Manchester, the results of their trip.

Attending for the Manchester Local were Frank Kelly, Matthew Faton and Joseph Kulas.

In a series of reports on the activities of the convention, Manchester Union members will be given a summary of action taken.

One of the important resolutions passed by the convention, Mr. Kelly stated, was Resolution No. 15 concerning the World Federation of Trade Unions.

This motion condemns the present use of the World Federation for anti-unionistic political purposes, and urges that the CIO withdraw wholly from the organization as it now stands organized.

Next of resolutions.

The Resolution, as adopted, follows:

The TWUA was created by the trade unions of the world as a means of labor participation in the post-war world. TWUA was conceived as an organization through which the common aspirations and hopes of the working people of the world could be united into policy and action directed toward post-war reconstruction and labor participation in the writing of the peace.

TWUA wholeheartedly supported the anti-Communist movement and joined in cooperative efforts for relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction of war-devastated countries. Ever conscious of the dangers to freedom, we urged that food and aid be extended to needy people of the various countries but that no circumstances used as a means to coerce or influence them in their rights of self-government.

At the London conference of February, 1945, TWUA welcomed the declared purpose of the Allied governments to give effect to the principles of the Atlantic Charter and jointly to assist the people in every liberated country in creating the conditions in which a stable and representative government, resting upon the free consent of the people, can come into existence. TWUA spoke of a world peace insured by industrial development of the undeveloped countries; full use of material resources and an economic organization in which production, full employment and a rising standard of living would be possible in all lands. These inspirational ideals were reaffirmed at the Atlantic conference and forward-looking programs and social reforms were formulated.

But in the years following the war it has become painfully clear that the representatives of the Russian labor unions look upon these objectives as mere slogans to furnish them a world forum to further the expansionist drives of the Russian government.
