





## "I had the good luck to be a prisoner of war"

That's the moving statement in a letter from a young German who spent 20 months in America as a prisoner of war during World War II.

He draws a grim picture of the difference between life in free America, even as a prisoner of war, and his present life under socialism in the Russian Zone of Germany.

"You Americans worry about your freedom because you still have it," he writes. "But socialism means the loss of many other things. The wheels of progress not only stop, but eventually turn backward. You find your time taken up by fighting for your basic needs like food and shelter, against an even more obstructing bureaucracy."

A message like this has a meaning to all Americans. Especially today, when we all are willingly giving government vast powers over our plans, our businesses, our very lives—as the cost of arming against aggression.

But some Americans are trying to take advantage of the present emergency by urging that government own and run many businesses and services permanently - the railroads, and the electric light and power companies, for example.

There's a great difference between giving up our freedoms temporarily and losing them permanently to a more and more powerful government. It's the difference between freedom and socialism.
