



The council said it "exerted unusual care and diligence before making its decision because of Dr. Ivy's outstanding record as a medical researcher and his achievements as a scientist." Dr. Ivy announced the introduc-tion of krebiozen last March at a meeting of 100 physicians and sci-entists. At that time he said the enting of 100 physicians and sci-entists. At that time he said the drug had been tested on 22 pa-tients in whom it had accom-plished some improvement in health. He emphasized, however, that krebiozen was not a cancer cure but was a "new kind of medi-cine" that deserved further inves-tigation. The American Medical Associa

The American Medical Association on Oct. 25 said a study of the case histories of 100 cancer paients treated with kreblozen failed to show the drug had "beneficial affects."

Dr. Ivy, as an officer of the Areblozen Research crebionen Research Foundation, said, however, that krebiozen still was under "extensive clinical investigation."
Dr. Stevan Durovic, former, Yugoslav physician now living in Chicago, discoverer of krebiozen, claims to extract it from the blood serum of horses after he has stimulated one of their fundamental cell systems by a secret process.

In 1934 Congress passed the first Reciprocal Trade Agreements Act, which was a serious attempt to change the climate of world trade by using our great bargaining power to cut away the spreading thicket of world trade barriers. In those days everybody was trying to sell more and buy less; this was thought to be a way to cure unemployment, but on the whole it probably made unemployment worse. Congress gave the State Department broad powers to reduce our tariffs, which had reached an all-time high with the Smoot-Hawley act of 1930, and these powers have been renewed and extended, half a dozen times since."

Continuing with his second point in regard to our economic policy. Our special efforts to revive and re-arm Europe, the European Recovery Program, Mr. Jeasup stated that in most respects this policy of putting Europe back on its economic feet with grants of money. In doing so we publicly announced that we would stick with this policy for four years. We estimated it would cost \$17 billion in grants and loans over the four years, and we more or less indicated that Congress would probably vote something like that sum in annual instalments. That was at least an implied commitment... This policy will have cost us not \$17 billion but \$13 billion.
