By LARRY ALLEN \*capable of defending Viet Nam is

Dalat. Indochina, Dec. 19—18—
Here in this pretty little mountain lake town 200 miles northeast of Saigon, the future soldiers and officers of the Viet Nam army are being trained how to defend their country.

Dalat has become a sort of "West Point" with Frenchmen, long experienced in warfare, teaching young Indochinese first how to be good soldiers and secondly, how to become first-rate officers.

In little more than a year, nearly 2,000 have been commissioned as second lieutenants. They are being assigned to the four Viet Nam fighting divisions already organized, and four others expected to be ready by the end of 1952.

Many of their countrymen long have been fighting slongside the French forces under General Jean de Lattre de Tassigny in the war against the Communist-led Vietminh troops and guerrillas of Ho Chi Minh.

The idea now is to give Viet The forces under General Jean of the primary concerns of Chief of State Bao Dai and his government chiefs.

All look forward to the day when the Communist-led Vietminh will be 'driven out. When the French pull out, the independent, fleedgling state of Viet Nam wants to be able to look after its own interests.

Bao Dai keeps a close check on the progress being made to build up the army. He couldn't be in a better spot to do it. Dalat is his official residence.

Modest "Palace"

Bao Dai lives quietly in a modest, but attractive villa not far from the little lake in the heart of the community. His home is referred to as the "palace," but there's nothing about it that suggests more than a modest home.

Dalat, which looks like it has a population of 3,000, but actually may have 20,000 residents scattered in the surrounding mountains, is well guarded.
