

UN Adopts Kidnaped Infant Found Plan to Bar Aggression

Paris, Jan. 12—(P)—The United Nations adopted to-day, over bitter Russian opposition, a plan designed to meet the threat of aggression anywhere in the world through collective action. The vote was 51 to 5, with three absentions

The resolution would permit the United Nations to call on regional security forces, such as the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), to meet aggression anywhere.

Soviet bloc countries cast the five negative ballots. Argentina, India and Indonesia abstained.

Western statesmen recently have expreased fears following pointed remarks by Boviet Foreign Minister Andrei Vushinsky—that the Communists might try to step up their push in southeast Asia.

The assembly also adopted another resolution which recommends a high level meeting of the Security Council whenever such a conference promises to be fruitful, "to consider what measures might ensure the removal of the tension at present existing in international relations and the establishment of friendly relations between countries..."


