Your 1951 Taxes

Head of Household And Estimated Tax

Washington, Feb. 8—(F)—This story deals with the problem of (A) filing an estimated tax return on 1952 income and (B) a new feature in the law called "Head of Household."

'The Estimated Tax In 1952 most people will have their full tax for the year regularly withheld from their pay. They're on a Tull pay-as-you-go basis and at the end of the year won't owe any tax. They just file a return then.

But some people—either unmarried or legally separated—runna household, with household expenses as large as those of married couples. Until now Congress overlooked them.

Instead, you must use a special form—called 1040-ES—which is printed in green ink. On the back is the new tax table for people with under \$5,000 income and the new tax rates for people with income of \$5,000 or more.

(But you can use form 1040, which was your return for 1951, as a guide in using 1040-ES. The methods used on both are the same. It's the tax rates which are different on the two forms.)

The Internal Revenue Bureau has sent 1040-ES forms to everyone who filed an estimate last year. If you need one, get it from your collector or the nearest postoffice.

On the back of that form 1040-ES is a pretty detailed explanation on who must use it to file a declaration of estimated tax.

In trying to decide whether you must file this estimate, be sure to exclude from your estimated 1952 income any income which is tax-free, like social security benefits and benefits under the Railroad

Also, in using 1040-ES, you claim all the exemptions and deductions to which you're entitled. Previous stories in this series explained the 1951 rules on exemptions and deductions. They're unchanged in 1952.






