






New 115,000 Volt Line and Substation Provides More Electric Power

Connecticut Power Co. Provides For Manchester's Growing Load

Line and Station Now In Service

However, just in case any "bugs" developed in the new equipment the Company waited until February 12th before lacing its new transmission facilities "in permanent service." The new facilities consist of a 115,000 volt two circuit steel ower line from Hartford, a new 115,000 volt transformer installation in Hartford and a new 115,000 volt substation i fanchester. Power for the Manchester area, which was preiously brought over a 22,000 volt two circuit wood pole line, comes to the new station on Olcott Street at 115,000 volts. There it is stepped down to 22,000 volts at which voltage it is fed to Manchester and also back to East Hartford to carry a part of the Hartford Electric Light Company load in that area. The planning of the new facilities started in 1948 and orders for some of the equipment were placed in that year. Work on the line started in the spring of 1951 and it was first energized


Part of the Line of High Tension Towers Carrying Electricity To Manchester

Intelligence Tests State Allocates Subject of Talk \$40,000 for CD

Miss Genevieve Scannell, reading consultant for Manchester schools, talked about intelligence testing at a meeting of the Child Study Group, Tuesday, at the Washington School. Members of the group were shown the materials used for testing children from two to young adult age and were told of the methods used.

Miss Scannell spoke of the importance of having a child willing and anxious to play the games and answer the questions pertaining to pictures, objects and stories that are a part of the test. They do not realize they are being tested. To them it is actually an interview or a game.

For an accurate test it is better not to have a classroom teacher give an intelligence test since she is trained to help her pupils, and the tester must not by any word or sign help a child to answer questions, but must follow standardized questions, and score according to the response of a child, as directed in the test guide. The test is more accurate when made without the presence of parents as a child naturally looks to a parent for help approval or disapproval.
