

Merritt Parkway Total Cost Paid

Bridgeport, March T—(P)—The \$21 million Merritt Parkway has been paid for, Theodore S. Wat-son, of Greenwich, chairman of the Parkway Commission, reported yesterday at a meeting of the commission. A \$15,000,000 parkway bond issue sold by Fairfield County in 1935 to assist in financing construction of the 37-mile super highway was retired Nov. 15, 1951, Watson said.

Total cost of the Parkway as of Dec. 1943, according to State Highway department digures, was \$21,225,334. \$21,225,334.

Of this amount an initial payment of approximately \$6,000,000 was made out of highway funds by the state, and the balance came

from the county bond issue, re-payment of which, including prin-cipal and interest, was assumed by the state.

Since the bond issue, the state has used a million dollars a year out of highway funds to retire parkway bonds, plus the yearly interest.
Watson pointed out that the toll on the parkway will continue although the Parkway bonds have Revenue from toll receipts on the Merritt Parkway are devoted to the extension of the Wilbur Cross Parkway and expansion of the parkway system in the state, under act of the state legislature.
