Toll-Free Calling to Hartford Proposed In New Manchester Telephone Plan

NEXT WEEK telephone representatives will begin an exchange-wide canvass of all Manchester customers to submit a plan to eliminate the present ten-cent toll charges for calls between the Manchester and Hartford exchanges.

Opinions will be carefully recorded - and, if the proposal meets with the approval of a substantial majority of Manchester customers, the new toll-free service will go into operation about the end of 1953.
