





Service Benefits will apply to all patients who are eligible (as with the surgical-obstetrical contract) for the period of hospitalization covered by CMS, as outlined in paragraph (1) above.

If your doctor is a Participating Physician in CMS payment will be made directly to him and you will be notified.

If your doctor is a Non-Participating Physician in CMS, payment will be made directly to you.

If the patient is entitled to Service Benefits, the payment by CMS for the day-visit on the fourth day and thereafter will be accepted by the Participating Physician as his total charge for each day he visits during the period of CMS coverage. The Service Benefit patient, however, will still be responsible for the Participating Physician's charges for the first three days.

When the patient is not entitled to Service Benefits, the same amount of payment will be made as a Contract Allowance, but (as with the surgical-obstetrical contract) the Participating Physician may make such additional charges as he feels are reasonable.

All payments for the services of Non-Participating Physicians will be made directly to the patient as Contract Allowances.

Bene's are available only when the patient is hospitalized in a licensed general hospital.
