

Washington, June 23—(#)—Funeral services will be held Wednesday for James W. Wadsworth, 74, former Senator and Representa-tive who sponsored pre-World War II draft legislation and headed the commission which drew up the proposed Universal Military Training program.
He died of cancer in Emergency Hospital Saturday night after a long illness.

Wadsworth was the fourth-man in American history to become a member of the House of Repre-sentatives after serving in the Senate. The others were John Quincy Adams, the sixth President, the late Theodore Burton of Ohio, and Sen, Matthew M. Neely (D-WVa.) A Republican from western New York state, Wadsworth was active throughout his career in building up the nation's defenses.
