Frederick William Gasson of East London, South Africa, said the South Korean government has trouble explaining the favored status to its citizens, whose ceonomy is war ravaged.

Gasson said he found canned vegetables and fruits in POW kitchens. Such foods are delicacies in the South Korean home. The South African said he sampled the prisoners' ration and found it good. Besides, POWs get 10 cigarettes a day — a bonus not required by the Geneva Convention.

That convention requires that war prisoners be fed well enough to keep them in good health and prevent loss of weight; have sufficient clothing for the climate, and be provided with housing as good as that of UN troops in the same area.
