War Front Deluged by Heavy Rain

Seoul, Korea, Aug. 18—(/P)
—The center of a typhoon—
with winds up to 100 miles an
hour—today hit Korea's west coast at Kunsan, 80 miles south of Seoul, and roared on across this peninsula toward the Sea of Japan. The ty phoon winds and rains bogged fighting and ground-ed warplanes all along the Korean war front.

There was no report of damage but the ship-wrecking atorm brought torrential rains to all of South Korea. Four to five inches South Korea. Four to five inches of rain were predicted for the battlefront tonight.
