population, they are lying, but it is true, nevertheless, that it is a weapon which possesses the sebacity to heat a whole villages into death in an instant and that many of the military targets we have attacked with it have been legislated in villages; so that there have been many horrible stories, by our own reporters of the scenes left in its wake.

We have used napalm heavily in Korea. As lately as July 21, we dropped 10,000 gallons of it on Pyongyang, the North Korean capital, in one single mass raid. 


