

He said he had heard that the pilot of a Communist plane shot down near Sunchon in June 1951 had survived and had shouted "Stalin, Stalin" to villagers who came to help him so "everyone knew he was Russian." Lee also said he had heard that the pilots of two Red planes shot down last spring in North Korea were Russians. He replied "yes" when asked if he thought there would be a UN victory. In response to the series of questions the North Korean made
