





Senator Benton's opponent may still try to claim that he doesn't know what was going on when he was serving as Vice President and President of the Connecticut Manufacturers' Association. But he is a businessman and in the Connecticut Manufacturers' Association he was in his chosen field of business. This is quite different from General Eisenhower leaving the Army

Most certainly, it doesn't seem credible that Senator Benton's opponent could have failed to know that the Connecticut Manufacturers' Association, during his tenure as Vice President and President, opposed a minimum wage; urged the open shop; fought price controls; denounced social security; battled better schools; denounced rent ceilings and low-cost public housing; and called a school lunch program "socialistic."

The usual Republican answer to any embarrassing question during this campaign has already been made to Senator Benton's T. V. broadcast of last Monday: "smear, innuendo, insinuation, and the rankest kind of sophistry."

These are strong words, and we won't try to answer them with stronger ones. We would, however, like to do one simple thing. We would like to present the record to Connecticut voters — who have always shown themselves capable of understanding facts and making up their own minds,






