





FHA Regulations Are Adopted by VA

Washington, Nov. 29 (47) The Veterans Administration announced today that minimum property requirements are now in effect on all new construction to be purchased with aid of VA guaranteed or insured loans.

The agency said that, in order to avoid duplication among federal agencies, it has adopted the applicable portions of the Federal Housing Administration's minimum property requirements and land planning builetin. It said most builders are familiar with them.


