Police worked today to identify 23 European holiday skiers killed yesterday when an avalanche roarng down Austria's Ariberg Pass blew their bus from a bridge and nto a stream 18 feet below. It was the year's biggest Alpine disaster. Six of the dead were members of a British party. The rest were helieved to be of German. Dutch French and Belgian nationality Thirteen of the dead were women. The bus carried an estimated 30 persons. Four of the survivors were njured seriously. The driver was not hurt and summoned workers from Langen, in western Austria, where the skiers had arrived a short time before by express train. Rescue workers were having a Mifficult time identifying the dead. The women's handbags were scat tered or jost in the debris. Some of the tourists were not carrying their passports on their persons Others were badly mutilated by the mass of snow and rock which partly buried the bus. Many of the group were young couples and there were some chil-


