



## **Town Revenue Report Made**

**Property Tax Payments** Total \$38,250 Since **Beginning Fiscal Year** 

Water collections from Aug. 15, water collections from Aug. 15, the beginning of the fiscal year, to Dec. 31 amounted to \$84,421.24 while the collections for property taxes totaled \$38,250.57 for the same period, a monthly report from Paul Cervini, collector of revenue, indicates. December collections were \$19,-746.10 for the water account, \$6,-164.32 for property taxes, and \$17,-317.44 from all other sources. Receipts from parking meter fees total \$11,978.52 so far in the current fiscal year while revenue fro the municipally-owned parking lo amounts to \$411.85. Revenue i December from the meters and th ot was \$3,196.25 and \$153.04, respectively.

This year's collections brought the meter and lot funds up to \$55,-564,52 which, after \$15,000 has been set aside for the purchase of property at Main and Pearl streets leaves a balance of \$40,-Other sources of revenue have
