The debt program may also have the effect of pushing up private interest rates, as government interest rates become more competitive. Business rates must, in general, be somewhat above government rates, to compensate for the greater security of government issues.

A general interest rate increase could be reflected in higher prices, as businessmen added their increased interest costs to the prices of their products.


