# To Gain Vegas

Seodl, Saturday, March 28—(P)—Grim U. S. Marines, re-coiling from a surprise 3,500-man Chinese Red onslaught against 10 outposts, last night regained one of the two west-ern front hills where other Marines had died to the last man.
