Says Humanity On Iron Cross

By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER

Washington, April 16—(P)—President Eisenhower challenged Russia's new leaders today to practice the peace they preach by agreeing to end the Cold War, disarm the world and invest the savings in a global fund to war on "the brute forces of poverty and need."

The alternative, he said, is at worst atomic war and at best unending fear which finds "humanity hanging from a cross

"Is there no other way the world can live?" Elsenhower asked.
"What is the Soviet Union ready Fire Deaths to do?
"The United States is ready "The United States is ready to assume its just part."

The Eisenhower plan—sure to create a sensation at this stage of East-West relations—was laid down in the President's first full dress speech on foreign policy since he took office in January. It was delivered before the American Society of Newspaper Editors (ASNE) and broadcast by all radio and television national hookups.
