

participated in the capture of Xiengkhouang, 90 miles southeast of Luangprabang. The French estimated the enemy column driving from the northwest was about five da from Luangprabang. The distant is only 50 miles but progress is slow over the narrow mountain trails which pierce thick jungles and are cut by swift streams. At the Plains of the Jars in the heart of Laos, enemy forces continued today to pump heavy mor tar shells into Franco-Latoian defense positions. They have not yet attempted an infantry attack. -A third invasion column from the north, meanwhile, drew steadily closer to the plain, one of the lef French defensive positions Their arrival might signal an assault on the French lines. The movement of Vietminh troops westward from the plain sector, however, indicates their top objective is to capture Luangprabang. The little town is the residence of 67-year-old King Sisavang Vong and is strategically

located on the important Mckong The French and Latoians are rushing a buildup of the defenser of Luangprabang and Vientiane the administrative capital 146 miles farther south.

The capture of the two towns would give the Vietminh roughly all of Laos, one of the three associaled states of Indo-China and a key region in the defense of the rest of southeast Asia against Communist aggression.




