Escaped Killer Is Recaptured: Hunt Going On (Continued from Page One) returned him early today to Matteawan State Hospital at Beacon, an institution for the criminal insans. The troopers did not divulge what they learned from Wood, except to say he denied knowing the whereabouts of his companions. Recapture of Wood did little to alleviate the fear that has gripped a large part of the Dutchess Couny countryside since the three men escaped. Numerous farmers and other residents have been guarding their families with shotguns, and keeping them indoors. Hopewell Junction is about 5 miles north of Times Square i Manhattan. Fishkill is about four miles southwest of here, and Beacon is four miles farther in that direction. The fact that Wood was caught only four miles from the hospital increased hope of the posse that the other two escapes also would be taken. The searchers used bloodhounds and walkie-talkie sets as they worked through the countryside. spotted with swampy land and dense woods.
