To Halt Forest Fires in North

Concord, N. H., July 1- A- A pall of dirty, brown smoke hung over northern and western New Hampshire today as 800 firefighters battled to halt four major forest fires. The smoke rose to 6,000 feet. An air flight over the fire areas showed 2,200 blackened and char-red acres on Shaw Mountain near Ossipee and Tuftonboro where un-derbrush and pine growth sucumbed to flames.

On the east side of the mountain, a 10-mile fire line was smouldering and burning fiercely in spots. Huge clouds of smoke billowed toward the Atlantic before a west wind. Fire fighting forces from Massachusetts, Maine and Vermont, and the Navy were brought into play with those of New Hampshire in the woods fight. During the next two days, radio lanes all over the Pacific buzzed with reports that Amelia's voice had been heard. Some reported mysterious dash signals and a "radio squeal." Coast Guard and other listeners reported hearing that a man's voice or a woman's voice.

If Noonan's navigation was faulty—why couldn't the plane have been far from its last reported position?

Was Amelia forced down on a deserted, lonely atoll?

Or did her plane, out of gas, simply plunge into the Pacific?

Each passing year makes the latter seem more likely.

There were various interpretations. Some searchers thought it meant the plane was sinking.

Amelia's husband, George Palmer Putnam expressed belief t meant the plane was on a reef. and that the gasoline necessary to keep the radio apparatus going was nearing exhaustion. navigator, Fred Noonan, was the greatest mass air rescue effort undertaken up to that time. The expedition finally included more than 3,000 men, 10 ships, 102 American fighting planes and in undisclosed number of Japanese nacy aircraft. But the story wasn't finished. For years her fate was the sub-

ject of wild rumors.
War Moves West As the war in the Pacific moved were repeated again and again that Amelia had been forced down or deliberately had landed on one of the islands mandated to covered fortifications and other secret installations. A Navy spokesman said again




