Despite the cuts already made, some of the Directors felt there could have been more. Director Harry J. Firato pointe to the \$1.735,200 remaining in the Board of Education budget as one item that could have stood furthe reduction, even though it had al-ready been reduced by \$25,000. Director Matthew Paton and Mahoney put themselves on record as being opposed to the appropria-tions for an assistant to the general manager and an assistant to Superintendent of Schools Arthur H. Illing. Mahoney also opposed the \$3,000 appropriation for the

Development Commission. One item that some of the Di rectors wanted to see increased however, was that for the pay of hourly rated employes. Paton sought to amend the motion calling for the budget appropriation to provide for an additional \$1,500 to permit these employes to be placed on a standard pay scale fter only one year, but this failed to carry when it received the votes only three-Directors Paton, Mahoney and Fairbanks.

Adopts Compromise Instead. the board formally adopted as policy a compromise plan to permit the employes to ad-vance, from s probationary pay scale after two years. Martin had originally suggested a five-year-probationary period, since the new pay scale now being put into ef-fect will automatically increase
