High Court To Resume On Monday

Washington, Sept. 30 (AP)-President Eisenhower today named Gov. Earl Warren of California to be Chief Justice of the United States. The President told his news conference the 62-year-old Warren, a Republican, will make a great Chief Justice, and that he will be on the bench of the high court when it opens its fall session Monday. Recess Selection
The recess appointment of Warren as successor to the late Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson is subject to Senate confirmation when Congress reconvenes in January. Vin-son died of a heart attack Sept. 8. Warren's appointment had been so widely predicted that the President, in announcing it, remarked that he was confirming something that was hardly news.
The President described Warren as a man with a reputation for integrity, honesty and middle of the road politics. He went on to say the new Chief
