The movement to set aside one Sunday a year to honor the Good Thief, who 'stole' Heaven in his dying moments, began last year among members of the National Catholic Prison Chaplains' Assn. At the annual Congress of Correction last October, it was pointed out that the move to establish "Good Thief Sunday" would not only promote devotion to St. Dismas but would also point up for penal and correctional leaders the important role of religion in social rehabilitation.

Such emphasis is especially important these days, the Congress members pointed out, when so much stress is laid upon the psychological and materialistic aspects of correction.

Perhaps few people realize that throughout the state of Connecti-cut there are laid out over 500 miles of hiking trails, more than any other state in New England except New Hampshire, many of them over privately owned land. others through state parks and forests. These are described in a book entitled "Connecticut Walk Book." which is published by the Connecticut Forest and Park Assn., a new edition of which will be published soon.

Manchester has its share of these trails, thanks to the untiring efforts of a few volunteers who have explored the surrounding country, laid out, and marked the

It is understood that no fires are to be started and that the hiker will not abuse the courtesy of the property owners. Fires may be lighted where official tireplaces are provided, usually in state forests and parks, but this privilege is withdrawn between Oct. 15 and Dec. 1, and between March 1 and May 15, because of the special fire danger in these periods.

Trampers are expected to follow the route indicated and not to rosm at will through the property. At all times, they should destroy no vegetation, respect rare flowers and leave no litter.
