Leyte Fire Blast

Blamed on Fluid

said that when rescue parties were to be sent below in search of possibly trapped crew members "there were more volunteers than we could allow in the spaces."

A high-ranking official discounted the possibility of personner failure and sabotage.

Vice Adm. John J. Ballantine, commander of the Atlantic Fleet Air Arm, came to Boston yesterday from his headquarters at Norfolk, Va., to survey the wrecked below-decks section of the 856-foot carrier.

Later, he told a news conference he is convinced the explosion and

he is convinced the explosion and fire were due to a "materiel fail-ure" of some sort and added: "We cannot attribute it to a personnel

cannot attribute it to a personner failure."

No Sabotage Involved

He said also he doesn't think sabotage was involved in the explosion while the Leyle was tied up at the South Boston Annex of the Boston Naval Shippard last Friday.

"It it was sabotage," he said, "the saboteur was killed."

Ballentine said nine top catapult experts of the Leyls and the Boston Naval Shippard were killed in the blast and flash fire.

He agreed with Capt. Ahroon that the accidental ignition of vaporized catapult hydraulic oil caused the explosion.

Ahroon told the opening session of a Naval board of inquiry hearing it was his opinion the hydraulic fulid, pumped to high pressure, leaked out of the machinery "through a pinhole" which alomized it into an explosive vapor.
