Senate Gets \$1.8 Billion Roads Bill

Washington, April 3 (AP)—The House passed and sent to the Senate today a compromise \$1,800,000,000 anti-freeway highway construction bill.

The Senate seemed likely to approve the measure today after the White House authorized Congress to start a 10-day Easter recess later today.

House passage was by roll call vote. The margin was 247-137.

Previously the House defeated a bill to attempt to send the bill back to a Senate-House conference committee for further consideration.

Major differences between the original Senate and House versions was inclusion by the Senate of a provision intended to speed the construction of toll roads. The Senate version also included a provision for toll roads.

House rejection of the compromise would have precluded further action on the measure until April 24, when the Congress would reconvene after a 10-day Easter recess starting later today.

Senate passage was considered certain, because the conference on Tuesday largely accepted the Senate version.

House members signed Tuesday the Senate's first anti-recession bill—a \$1,800,000,000 highway bill.

But Senate Republicans the same day staved off the Democratic drive for fast action on other measures. They won a close fight to put over until April 14 a bill carrying \$1 billion in loan funds for local public works projects.

In the House, however, it was Democratic leaders who privately expressed doubts about some parts of the highway bill.

Opposition in the House appeared to center on the provision for construction of toll roads along the 4,000-mile network of interstate highways being built—the interstate system.

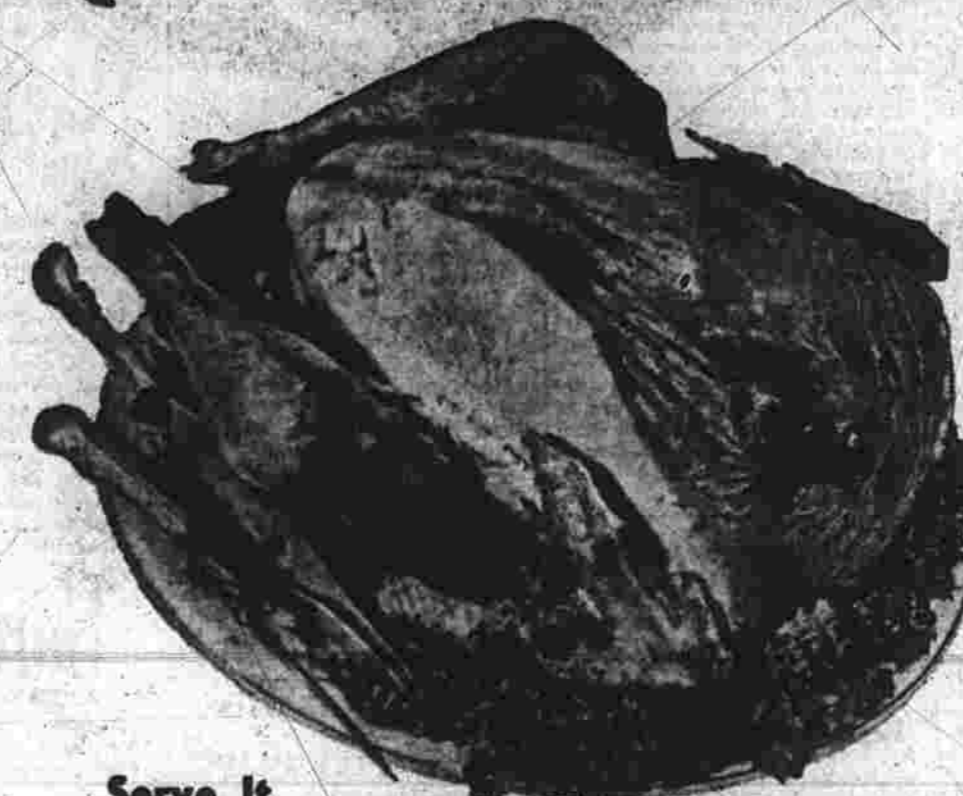

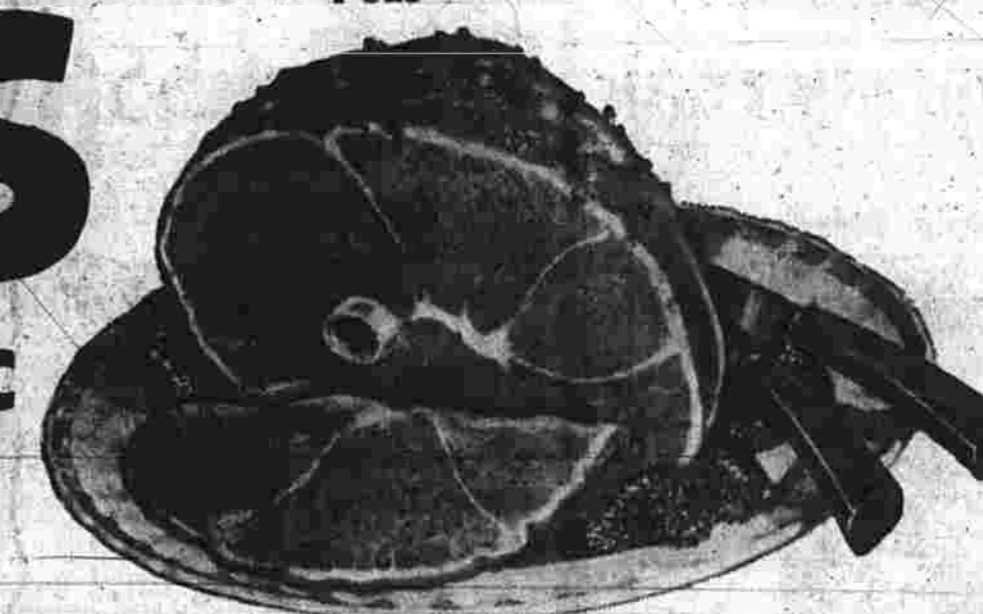

The storm whipped rain in southern New England and west as far as 12 inches deep, in Maine on late-force winds.

The storm is the 18th to hit New England since December and considered by many the worst spring storm in some 21 years.

The storm buffeted the western Gloucester fishing vessel Baby Rose and snapped one of her steering struts, leaving her helpless 180 miles east of Boston until emergency repairs were made.

One of her crew of seven, John W. O'Brien, 45, Gloucester, sustained several broken ribs when he was tossed against a bulkhead.

The Coast Guard sent two vessels to assist the Baby Rose but they turned back when the fishing vessel's skipper, Vincent Ciampere, 40, Gloucester, said he could proceed safely to port.

Another storm-caused injury was that of John J. Davis, 45, of Quincy, a cameraman for WHDH-TV Boston who suffered a broken leg when blown off a seawall while photographing the storm at Severs.

No deaths were reported.

Washington, April 4 (AP)—House investigators said today "questionable conduct" by some FCC members and agents of the broadcasting industry have seriously undermined public confidence in the FCC.

This appraisal came in a stinging report by the House subcommittee on Legislative Oversight. The group has been engaged since Jan. 27 in a study of federal regulatory agencies, with a look first at the Federal Communications Commission.

It said its hearings on the FCC have revealed that over the years a pattern has developed of questionable conduct on the part of some members of the commission and on the part of some industry organizations and members of industry who are subject to commission regulation.

The report added that the questionable propriety of some of the subcommittee's own actions has also been brought to its attention. It said the subcommittee's own actions have been "inappropriate" and "in violation of the law."

The report did not mention any specific violations.

But Chairman Harris (D-Ark.) said he would not see any action in the Justice Department, except from taking some action in matters of interstate commerce.
