

Midland, Mich., April 7 (AP) —A Capital Airlines British-built Viscount airliner slammed into the muck of a corn field during an eastern snowstorm last night, killing all 47 persons aboard. A chief Civil Aeronautics reau inspector said today it prob-ably would take the rest of the week to find out why.

The big plane, powered by four turboprop engines, plunged into the ground about 2,300 feet short the southwest-northeast runway of the Tricity Airport. The suppor serves Midland, Saginaw and Bay

CAB investigator Fred G. Powell said a preliminary investigation indicated the craft exploded after hitting the ground. He added how ever that it was entirely too early to get even a possible cause fi the disaster, worst in the history of commercial aviation in Michi-

gan. Powell assembled six CAB spe-cialists to study the crash. The Civil Aeronautics Administration sent in six other experts. Capital Airlines is conducting still a third
