Cambridge, Mass, April 10 (4)—Russia's giant Sputnik II is about to make a flaming exit from Outer Space. And there's belief that the Sovieta scored an even greater scientific feat with their dogcarrying moon than first recognized.

The satellite, experts at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory here say, is expected to make its final plunge through the Earth's atmosphese sometime Saturday afternoon or evening. The and may well be spectacular, with the satellite glowing like a meteor and visible over a wide area.

Launched last Nov. 3 with the shaggy dog Laika aboard, the finition weight of the Soviet moon with its canine space pioneer astonished the world. America's three circling satellites are midgets by comparison.

Today, some scientists at the observatory think the Soviet accomplishment of orbiting a dog with food, water and an air-conditioning system able to keep it alive for a week was actually considerably more impressive than the western world realizes.

We know because every Thursday afternoon for the past month we've watched young attractive Dorothy Les use these tools as ahe prepared superb disnes from China's classic cuisine. Mrs. Lee teaches food and nutrition, with the blessing of New York City's Board of Education, at China Institute in America.

The fascinating utensil called a wok is a shallow bowl-shaped metal cooking pan with a round bottom; it is cradled by a steel ring and is used on a top burner of a gas range. The combination of this particular pan and the intense heat produce the deligniful bright color and crispness that distinguish so many Chinese dish-es. Some food, such as whole fish, are steamed and served with wok ooked sauces.

Net to the deterity and rapidity with which Mrs. Lee cooks, we admire the skill and speed with which she uses a sharp cleaver to slice, mince, chop and shred meat, poultry, fish, vegetables and fruit. Here's one of Mrs. Lee's recipes that may be made with or without a wok: we've prepared it severa mes in a 10-inch iron skillet. But you are intrigued by Chinese dishes and want to include a good many in your repertoire, you'll find woks and steel rings as well as cleavers endlessly useful. They're available in shops in

Mrs. Lee prepares pepper steak in a Wok—a round-bottom metal pan that fits over the burner of a gas range.






