Soviet, government yesterd for beginning talks in Moscow at the ambassedor level. Shortly after the Soviet note was delivered in Moscow, the white ouse branded as unacceptable the price Russia set for its participa-tion in such preliminary talks.

The conditions stated by Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko were contrary at every point to th known policies of the western pow-ers. This caused speculations here is to why the Sovieta sent such a Two possible explanations were ffered by officials today.

One was that the Soviets do not iously want a summit confer nce in the immediate future, but propaganda over the issue. U.S. uthorities concede that so far the tussians are shead in the propaganda game. The Russians are trying to persuade world opipion that they are more place loving and

more anxious for summit settlements than is the West. The other motive/suggested wa Soviet Premier Khrushche wants a summit conference, but is confident that by manipulating world opinion he can force the western powers to go into such a conference on Russia's terms. The United States, Britain and France, acting on behalf of the whole 15 nation NATO group, had

proposed March 31 that diplomatic talks be started in Moscow in the latter part of April, to be followed by a foreign ministers meeting. The western Big Three said th purpose of the preliminary sesions would be to look into issu
