questions concerning myasthenia whether there is a cure and if an excess of x-rays could produce the condition or aggravate it.

The first question can only be answered, unfortunately, by the statement that the cause is not known. Treatment I shall discuss

later.
On the last question I do not know of any evidence that an excess of x-rays is related in way to the cause, nor has it any way to the cause, nor has it been incriminated as an aggravating martor. Of course excessive x-rays are inadvisable on their own account.

Myasthenia gravis, although first described in the 17th century, has been considered a rather rare disease, though it now appears to be more frequent than was previously believed.

The symptoms vary considerably Some persons with myasably. Some persons with myas-thenia gravis have difficulty in

lifting the lids of their eyes. Some-times talking or swallowing is af-fected. Considerable fatigue of some of the voluntary muscles is the rule. The disease is not asso-

ciated with pain.

The diagnosis of myasthenia gravis is not always easy, but a rapid diagnostic test has been described. In one report of this test 300 persons were referred to the examining physicians as possibly having the disease and the diagnosis was established in 110 of these.

The development of a good diagnostic test is important since, as indicated, the symptoms vary considerably and therefore a person can have myasthenia gravis for quite a long time before diagnosis is made.




