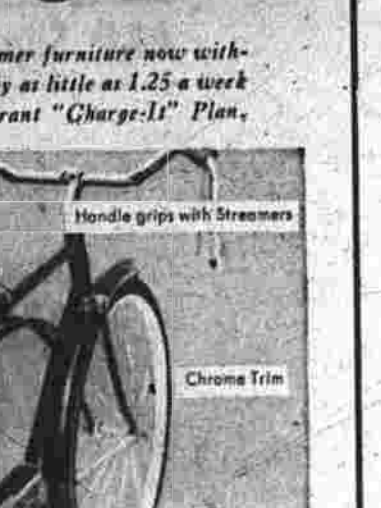

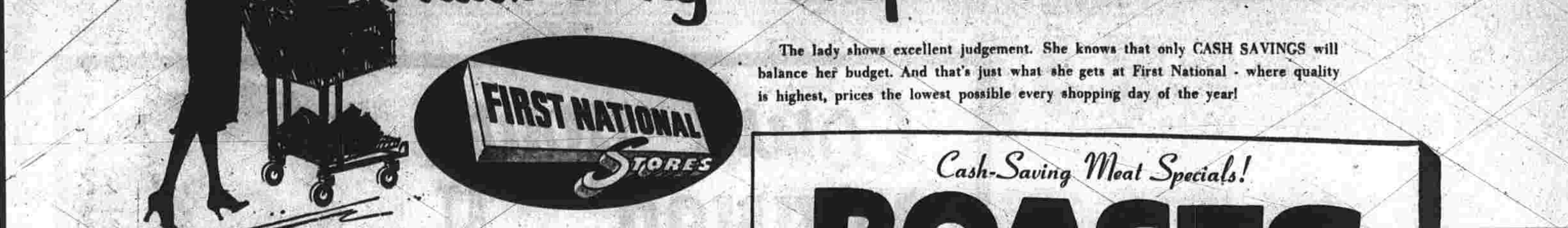

U.S. Underestimated Anti-American Feeling

BY JAMES MARLOW
(AP News Analyst)

Washington, May 15.—The Eisenhower administration apparently has been lulled into believing that the anti-American feeling in Latin America has been brought under control. It is not, says James Marlow, an analyst for the New York Times, but a feeling that is spreading rapidly.

Mr. Marlow said that the administration has underestimated the depth of anti-American feeling since the State Department and the Central Intelligence Agency, the country's eyes and ears abroad, have agents everywhere.

Didn't Blame Reds

Mr. Marlow himself didn't attempt to blame what happened to Nixon entirely on the Communists. He said "I don't think there is any single cause. There are economic causes."

The President indicated to his news conference that the possibility of Nixon's second term in Latin America was expected, though some anti-American shouts and pamphlets were heard in the streets of Caracas, Venezuela, and in Bogota, Colombia.

Mr. Marlow said that the anti-American feeling was not a new phenomenon. It has been around since the days of the Monroe Doctrine. He said: "No, these things were discussed but no thought was

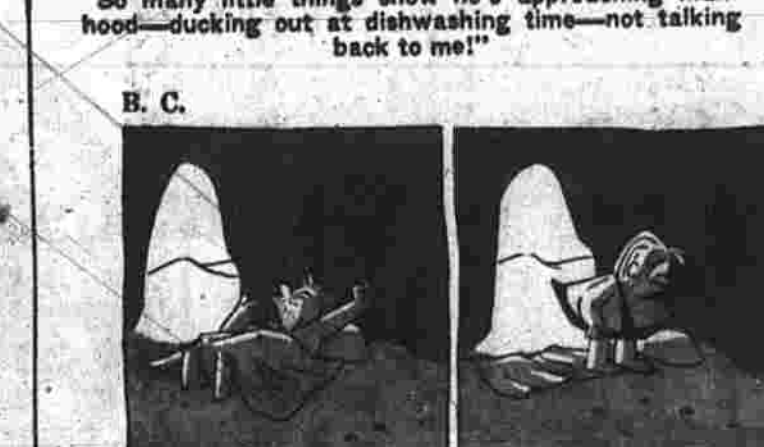

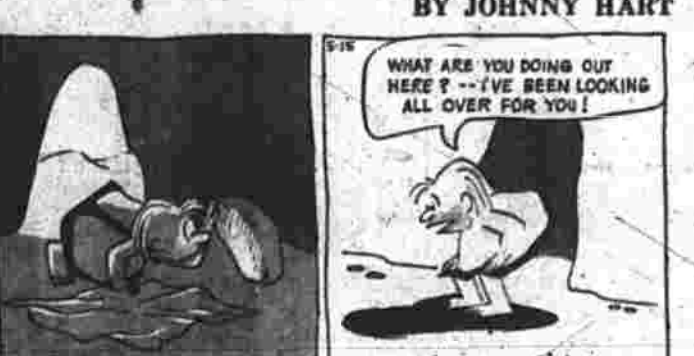
