



We can't have everything.
Our satellites are better instrumented than Russia's sputniks, but ours travel in orbits near the earth's equator while the sputniks are in more nearly polar orbits, are in more nearly polar orbits, traveling across almost all latitudes.

We launch ours across the Atlantic to avoid danger to populated areas: The Russians can launch northward over Siberia with almost no danger.






