Paris, June 3 (AP)-Premier Charles de Gaulle, armed with all the broad powers he demanded of parliament, turned his attention today to Algeria and the army running it in his

De Gaulle summoned Gen. Raoul Salan, the French troop commander, from Algiers for consultation. Salan has been ruling Algeria openly in the name of the rebellious French there. An escort waiting at the airport whisked him off to see De Gaulle.

After thus asserting his authority over the army, De Gaulle called in Robert Lacoste, resident minister in Algeria who has a big following among the rebellious French colonists there: De Gaulle will go to Algeria himself tomorrow. De Gaulle installed himself in
