### Rafael at Sea But Zsa Zsa, Kim Miss Boat

San Pedro, Calif., July 16 (AP)—With a striking brunette in a skin-tight scarlet dress aboard, Gen. Rafael Trujillo Jr. has gone to sea in his luxurious "Smatser," the Angelita.

The brunette's name and the Angelita's destination were both mysteries today. But when the 250-foot yacht eased past the breakwater here last night, she turned south.

A colorful band played on the tannal as the Angelita disappeared into the evening mist. By the time the Angelita slipped her anchor, the band had been playing farewell music for eight hours.

All was in readiness for the departure yesterday morning when suddenly the brunette in red boarded the yacht at the San Pedro dock.

Leaving activities destined and the 25-year-old Dominican general launched a party.

There, at 2 p.m., newsmen at dockside saw the brunette sprint down the gangplank. She sat on a piling and wept bitterly.

When a pilot went aboard, the brunette slipped up the gangplank behind him. The gangplank was swung aboard and the Angelita moved to sea.

Consular officials of the Dominican Republic, where Rafael's father rules the roost, gave the yacht's destination variously as San Diego, San Juan, Mexico, Acapulco, Mexico.

The thing was certain, Zsa Zsa Gabor did not see Trujillo off. She was the general's warm friend when he arrived, but their friendship cooled when he carried a party she was planning to give for him.

### Troop 1 Scouts Visit Home of Shakespeare

The Manchester Senior Girl Scouts spent three days in Stratford-on-Avon, seeing famous literary sites such as Shakespeare's birthplace, Old Guild Chapel and the Shakespeare Memorial Theatre. This account, written by Emily Smith, one of their leaders, was mailed July 10 from London and tells of many encounters with other American Girl Scouts in the famous British literary center.

American Senior Girl Scouts were met in great numbers by the Scout Troop 1 of Manchester Avon last week.

Arriving in Stratford-on-Avon, after touring Wales and other parts of Great Britain, the local Scouts were surprised to find so many other American teenagers in green and blue uniforms in the popular little town. In fact, the town seemed full of American Girl Scouts.

Among those whom the local girls met were members of the Juliette Low Group, girls from all parts of the United States, a carefully selected to participate in international events in Switzerland, Finland and Greece this summer. Other troops whom the local girls met were troops from Pennsylvania, Fall River, Mass. and New Jersey. Some of these were encountered first in Stratford and later in London, all traveling as troops.

In many ways, this old Elizabethan farmhouse proved the most interesting of all the places connected with Shakespeare. Not only is it older, but there are many interesting relics in house and barn.

The highlight of the day was the picnic held by the side of the road as the group traveled on to Stratford. Sandra Stewart had been carrying two jars of peanut butter, which was certainly a treat in a foreign land. The lunch was supplemented with other items for sandwiches and fruit and cookies.

The sightseeing tour started with a visit to Shakespeare's birthplace, furnished very much as it was in his time. Many people have visited this old Elizabethan house, including Britain's present sovereign, Elizabeth II.

Other places visited that afternoon included the Old Guild Chapel, which dates back to medieval times; the Old Grammar School, a school still in use and which Shakespeare, much like many other famous men, had attended as a boy; Hall's Croft, home of Shakespeare's daughter and her husband; and New Place Gardens. The latter are beautiful formal gardens laid out on the site of the house in which the dramatist died.

Saroyan Play Solves Quest, Or Does It?

By JUDITH ABERN Is the man who loves a world of fantasy and illusion a fool or a genius? The audience at last night's performance of William Saroyan's "Jim Dandy" at the University of Connecticut Little Theatre, was kept in uneasy fascination as the company threaded out the problem. Under the direction of John Hallauer the problem was finally resolved in favor of the dreamer, but not before the argument for realism had been presented as winningly as that the audience felt the dreamer were, after all, a bunch of fools.

Hallauer used of course the traditional approach in underlining Saroyan's technique of freely associated incidents. He was helped greatly in achieving the effect he sought by some excellent set designs on the part of Frank Ballard and several fine individual performances from his cast. As Hallauer sees the problem, the characters are completely individual. Their relations with one another are an loosely integrated flow are related in a series of contrasts. Each character is a pebble of the two leading characters, Jim Dandy and Fashin. The performance of Frank Conroy as Jim Dandy is well thought out. It is that he loses a little spontaneity as a character. Another area which could be investigated with regard to Conroy's Dandy is the type of happiness for which he is seeking. If the happiness is limited to an ivory tower contemplation or to physical indulgence, is it worth the struggle between Dandy and Fashin? Indeed, can Dandy dare to reject the values in Fashin's philosophy? Saroyan did not intend that Dandy be so limited. George B. Wallis Jr. is excellent as Fashin. His only flaw was a slowness once or twice in picking up cues. His Fashin is believable, natural. In the midst of ethereal or exaggerated characters, Others who gave fine performances included Michael Levin as an energetic, witty, wise disciple of Jim Dandy, Miss Ruthie as the beautiful librarian, and young Peter Vestill as the boy. Lighting by Donald L. Murray was superb in that it created its effect without distracting from the smooth movement of the action. For those who enjoy Saroyan for those who enjoy surrealistic plays and for those who might enjoy comparing "Jim Dandy's" to "The Catcher in the Rye," the trip in the "Dance Comedy" Streets will be a rewarding one. Criticisms can attack the eyes at any age.

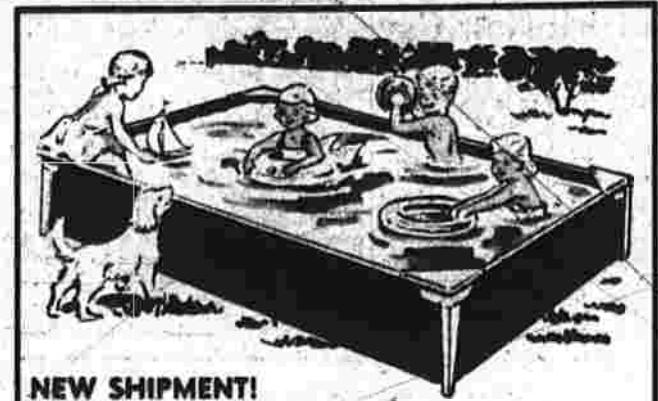

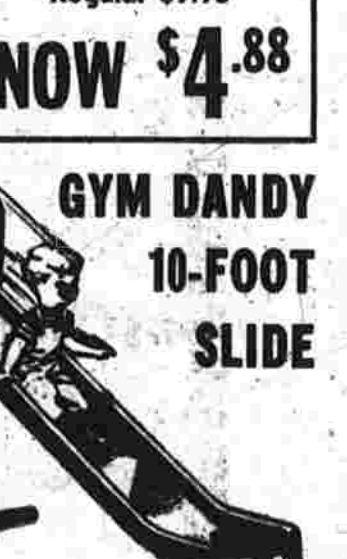

Plastic Adhesive Becomes Steel-Like

New York—One type of new high-temperature adhesive looks like plastic, but it becomes as strong as steel when it is applied.

In gluing surfaces together, the adhesive is combined with a small amount of a catalyzing chemical and it reacts quickly to form an invulnerable bond.

The adhesive, besides linking itself to the surfaces to which it is applied, binds together the powdered steel in the putty in effect, becoming solid steel that can be drilled or machined.

Tuning Device Tiny Los Angeles—A Los Angeles firm has introduced a tiny electronic component no larger than a teardrop, that can do a job similar to that of one having capacity used in AM and FM receivers.

The device, called a "tuning device," is made of a piece of plastic that is 1/16 inch long and 1/32 inch wide.

Writers Praised Cheshire Cheese London—Of all Britain's cheeses, by far the most popular is Cheshire, which takes its name from the village of Cheddar at the foot of the Cheddar Gorge in Somerset.

It is still made there, but also in many other parts of the country. Cheshire is the oldest British cheese to which references can be found. Writers as early as the 13th century praised it.

### Hal Boyle A Return to Sanity: The 3-to-1 Martini

New York (AP)—A happy oenologist sees a return to sanity in at least one pattern of American life. "I believe there will be a swing away from the present 5-to-1 martini and back toward the normal 3-to-1 ratio," said Dr. Frank Gallizio.

Dr. Gallizio, 35, Turn-brook, and as volatile as the products he studies, has been an oenologist, or professional student of wine and liquor, for 35 years. He says it is a very rewarding profession, and each year has been more golden than the one before.

For more than two decades he has been an authority on the martini, a drink which he regards as one of the finest of human character.

"Martini drinking is a wild for-

ple of bottled cheer from all parts of the world.

"Five out of 10 people think vodka is made from potatoes, but actually it is a grain product," he said. "It is filtered through a special grade of charcoal.

"Although Russians consume a great quantity of vodka, I am not sure they invented it. There is some evidence that vodka was first developed in the Middle Ages by Italian families that had migrated to the northern shore of the Black Sea."

One of Dr. Gallizio's chores is to create new vodka drinks to supplement the present popularity of the screwdriver, bloody Mary and Moscow mule.

From his laboratory, he has emerged such excitingly named concoctions as sack stout (vodka and champagne), Siberian mist (vodka, cranberry juice and lemon juice) and Katinika (vodka and apricot liquor).

One would think that after 35 years of thoughtful sipping, an oenologist might have a few enlightening secrets about the common hangover. But not so.

"I bet in all my life I did not have more than three or four times a hangover—a severe one," said Mr. Gallizio. "I have never made a profound study of it."

"I think there is practically nothing to do for the hangover, except maybe take a cold shower, black coffee and a massage."

"Put many ice cubes in the mixer. Pour in the vermouth and gin 60 seconds, and let it filter down slowly through the ice. Then stir once or two—quickly and non-stop."

"The martini will be dry and have a minimum of water."

Dr. Gallizio is firmly set personally against the addition of olive oil to give an oily flavor, or lemon peel (it changes the entire character of the drink).

"I prefer a small pearl onion—had only one in the martini," he said judiciously. "But ever better is a tiny green pepper preserved in wine vinegar. In my opinion that is best of all."

"I am not against the olive for everyone, mind you—only in my own martini. Heaven forbid, you might get an olive in which the oil had become a hot rancid."

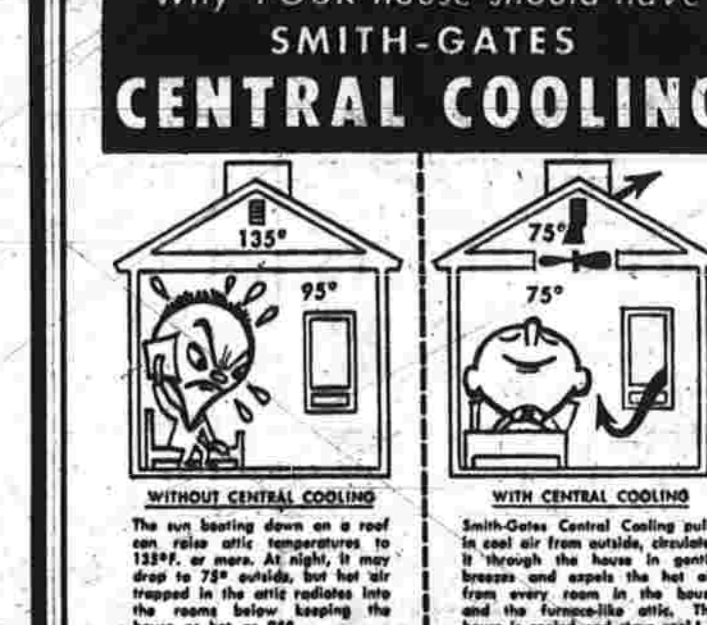

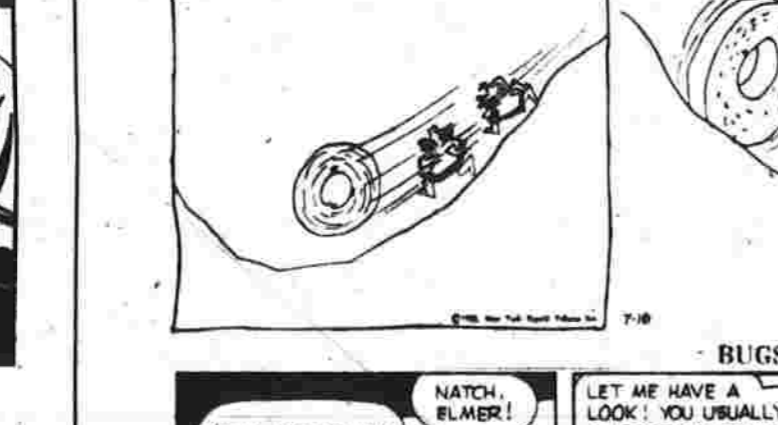
