

Doctor Says

CIATICA TREATMENTS VARY MOST VICTIMS CAN BE CUREI By EDWIN J. JORDAN, M.D. Written for NEA Service. Mrs. M. H. writes that she is 'a sad sufferer from sciatica," nd as she grows older the troue does not subside as quickly is it once did. She requests discussion of this subject, This term gets its name from a nerve called the sciatic nerve, which runs from the buttocks down the back of the leg. Normally, of course, this nerve is useful to us in serving the muscles and other tissues of that area.

cles and other tissues of that area.

Sciatica is generally used to describe pain in the area supplied by this nerve and is certainly unpleasant. In the past it was usually considered a single disease, but now it is thought to be present from any one of several different causes.

The most simple type of sciatica is neuritis from inflammation of the nerve itself.

This can result from such conditions as diabetes, any infection elsewhere in the body such as diseased tonsils, rheumatic disorders or vitamin deficiencies.

If such is the case, treatment If such is the case, treatment is aimed at identifying the source of the trouble and correcting it. In this variety of sciatic neuritis the administration of vitamin B-1 may sometimes prove help-hil

Many doctors believe that sci-s hernia or rupture of the car-atic pain is most often caused by tilage-like substance which lies between the vertebrae of the spinal column, or in the nerve spinal column, or in the nerve roots near the spinal discs.

When this is responsible for pain a variety of treatments may be tried, including placing the spine under traction. This stretches the vertebrae apart by pulling the head and feet in opposite directions.

The wearing of a corset or brace and sleeping on a stiff mattress are also methods that are used.

In some operation on the rup-In some, operation on the rup-ture of the cartilege-like sub-stance or the spinal vertebrae themselves has resulted in relief

In many cases of sciatic pain it is hard to decide what treatment to try. Injections are sometimes used, often with good results, sometimes without X-ray treatments, Exercises, as well as waninglations, and other man. manipulations and other meas-ures called physical therapy, have been successful in certain

cases.

Although the proportion of patients who can be successfully treated is larger now than in the past, there are still some who continue to suffer the pain of sciatica for lengthy periods in spite of all that can be done for them. Nevertheless, most sufferers from sciatic pain seem to make a complete or almost commake a complete or almost com-plete recovery in the course of
