By ROY ESSOYAN Moscow, July 18 (A)-A rowdy and raucous mob of more than 100,000 Russians smashed at least 275 windows in the U.S. embassy here today and stained the building with blue and green ink, hurled in bottles. The demonstration, the second in as many days protesting the landing of U.S. Marines in Leba-

An army general and a militia general directed the operations, with the help of prowl cars. Several demonstrators turned their placards into brooms and started heaping the debris of stones, bricks, sticks and posters

One of the last demonstrators to plant a placard on the em-bassy wall was a wartime amputee who drove onto the sidewalk in a 3-wheel car specially made for wounded veterans.
